Description

Course Description: This course examines issues relating to the skills that promote equal learning opportunities in the classroom, including effective approaches to working with colleagues, staff, parents, and students who are culturally, ethnically and socio- economically diverse. Interpersonal communication skills – to include speaking, listening, reading, and writing - and their effect on individuals, organizations, and communities will be discussed. Topics examined include ethnic, cultural, gender, class, religious, and linguistic diversity, as well as human exceptionality. The use of technology as an aid to effective communication will be presented. Laws and issues that have a bearing on curriculum and instruction for exceptional students will be examined.

Course Scope:

This course assists educators in developing increased diversity awareness, sensitivity and cross cultural understanding that will help them effectively teach and lead. By increasing edicators' knowledge and understanding of the background experiences, languages, skills, and abilities of student populations they are responsible for, they can better apply appropriate pedagogical principles and implement practices that lead to higher achievement for all students. Through coursework and fieldwork exercises, students learn about the ways in which teaching practices and student learning are shaped, informed, and impacted by diversity in their context.

- 1. Analyze cultural diversity.
- 2. Evaluate issues of racism, bias, and prejudice that impact the experiences of individuals and groups.
- 3. Evaluate specific issues associated with culturally diverse students.
- 4. Analyze strategies that encourage cultural awareness among students.
- Create learner centered environments that maximize the use of technology to increase academic outcomes for a diverse student population. (WVPTS: 1B1,1B2,1B3,1C3,2A1,2A3,2D2,3D3,3F1); ISTE:(1b,2c,3b,4b)
