**Length of Course: 16 weeks** 

# **Course Description (Catalog)**

The practicum is completed with a nurse leader in a selected setting where the student will develop proficiency to deliver quality cost-effective care; to participate in the implementation of care; and to assume a leadership role in the management of human, fiscal, and physical healthcare resources. Emphasis will be placed upon the application of complexity theory and systems thinking to effectively lead teams and promote change, as well enhancing business and financial judgement skills needed for the analysis of practice quality and costs.

### **Course Scope**

This course will allow students the opportunity to integrate nurse leadership theory and practice into practical, real-life experiences. Each student will find a preceptor (who must meet specified criteria) to serve as their clinical preceptor, and with whom they will have the chance to work in an area of interest to apply concepts and practices associated with the roles of a nurse leader. During this 16 week, 160 hour practicum course, students will work with a preceptor in a clinical setting.

### **Course Learning Objectives**

The following objectives are aligned with the MSN Program Outcomes (PO):

- 1. Assume a leadership role in the promotion of culturally responsive, high-quality care through effective healthcare team coordination and interdisciplinary communication.
- 2. Apply leadership skills to effectively design, implement, and evaluate patient safety and quality improvement initiatives.
- 3. Analyze factors that impact healthcare financing and the impact on the healthcare delivery system to delivery high quality care.
- 4. Reflect upon personal organizational and systems leadership skills critical to the promotion of high quality and safe patient care.

Module Learning Objectives are located within the course. Masters Essentials covered in this course include I-IX.

### **Course Delivery Method**

This course delivered via distance learning will enable students to complete academic work in a flexible manner, completely online. The 160 hours of the nurse educator practicum will take place in person in a clinical setting. The scheduling of these hours will vary to accommodate student and preceptor schedules and meet the course objectives. Course materials and access to an online learning management system will be made available to each student. Online assignments are due weekly as noted on the course outline and can include Forum questions and written assignments. Assigned MSN faculty will support the students throughout this sixteen-week course and is responsible for the final practicum assessment and evaluation of student attainment of objectives.

The School of Health Sciences requires use of APA format and style and all students are encouraged to have a current copy of the *APA Publication Manual*. All written assignments are to be submitted in APA format style unless otherwise noted in the assignment directions.

### **Discussions**

Please join the discussions each week. Replies must be posted in the week due and replies after the end of the each week will not be graded. The Discussions are for student interaction and input should be submitted before the week ends in order to fully participate in the discussions. Students should demonstrate their own knowledge in the discussions and avoid copying and pasting from websites. In this class there are 8 graded discussions.

### **Guidelines:**

- Post the initial response to each discussions by 11:55pm, ET, Wednesday
- Initial responses are to be original in content and demonstrate a thorough analysis of the topic.
- Reply to <u>more than 2</u> of your classmates in each forum by 11:55pm, ET, Sunday.
- Responses to classmates are significant to advance the discussions.
- All discussions can be accessed in the Discussions section of the course.
- Respond to all questions posed to you in your initial post by instructor and/or peers.

An initial post must precede the response posts to peers. An initial post received after Wednesday 11:55 pm will receive a 10% deduction for each day, for 3 days, prior to discussions being graded. This means the highest grade possible for a late submission of 3 days, is 70%. However, response posts are due by Sunday 11:55 pm. If response posts are not submitted by this time, the discussion is over. Therefore, no points can be awarded for collaboration, and the highest grade possible for late submission past 3 days is 60%.

### **Policies**

# **Nursing Program Policies**

### **Assignment and Coursework Grading Policy**

Students are expected to submit classroom assignments by the designated due date and to complete the course according to the published class schedule. Failure to submit coursework by the designated due date will result in a ten percent (10%) penalty per day until three (3) days after the coursework is due. Therefore, after three (3) days, the maximum grade the student can achieve with a late submission will be a grade of 70% (C-). If a student is ill, has a family crisis, or will miss scheduled coursework deadlines for any reason, the student shall notify the instructor in advance if at all possible. Assignments will NOT be accepted more than seven (7) days after the due date unless prior arrangements have been made in advance of the due date.

### **Use of Online Sources such as Course Hero**
